In Genesis, the third chapter begins with Satan's temptation of Eve and Adam. Specifically, Satan's offer was to doubt God's Word and obey him instead, with the promise that they would be like gods, knowing good and evil, if only they disobeyed God. Essentially, it was a temptation to suspect God's Word and seek power to become like gods. "Climbing the ladder to become gods" is Satan's offer and strategy. It is a common temptation for people to doubt God's Word in their pursuit of becom-

ing like gods. This temptation offers the enjoyment of the forbidden fruit (which is beautiful, tasty, and enlightening) and the promise of becoming powerful like gods, knowing good and evil, but it comes at the cost of suspecting God's Word and relying on the devil's suggestions and directions.

There are assured gifts of wealth and worldly pleasures that may be offered in return for disobedience to God, but they

come along with strife, sex, restlessness and a peaceless life. "No God and no peace" becomes the reality of day-to-day life, where all the blessings of abundance are present without true joy.

In today's rat race of life, people strive to excel and surpass others in everything. Loving their targets or goals in life with all their heart, mind, soul and strength more than God has become the norm, often claiming God's promises (quoted out of context) for this ignoble endeavour of becoming like gods. There is an assured gift of death, separation from God, resulting in eternal death when in the company of the devil. *People are driven to excel, improve and become great with all their heart, soul, mind, and strength.* However, Jesus says, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul

and with all your mind and with all your strength" (Mark 12:30).

Satan tempted Jesus to prove Himself by doubting God's Word and performing the miracle of turning stones into bread while He was hungry after forty days of fasting. The devil's final offer was to give Jesus all the world if He would worship him. This offer was a shortcut to win back the world without going to the cross. Many succumb to

> this temptation of following Jesus without the cross. However, "climbing the ladder to become gods" will never bring true joy and peace.

> Jesus said that anyone who wants to follow Him must deny themselves (their goals, desires and plans), take up their cross (God's plan and will) and follow Him (Mark 8:34). There is assured suffering (?) and resurrection, along with the saints,

with eternal life. This is beyond human understanding. But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law. (Galatians 5:22, 23). God's offer is always unique. Singing in prison, rejoicing in suffering and contentment in hunger are God's ways for His children, with the assurance as promised in the scripture verse "For the pagans (Godless - fools) run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. (Mathew 6:32, 33)".

Disobeying God in an attempt to elevate oneself to godlike status in life is a foolish path to take. The path of the cross, however, is truly amazing, unique and the way of Jesus.

For the past decade, I have been battling with ALS. (a nervous system disease that affects nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord.) My wife is the backbone of my ministry.
